

Enhancing Education Through Technology—Competitive (EETT-C)

This grant program provides funding for grades for 4-8 to assist eligible LEAs in using technology to enhance teaching and learning. Districts and direct-funded charter schools are required to have a state-approved technology plan to be eligible for these funds.
